Mercy seems to be an old-fashioned term, not often heard in the media or our everyday discussions. Frankly I'm not sure if it's even politically correct in our macro-statistical western society. When we turn on the TV or look at social networking, rarely are there stories that encapsulate the meaning of mercy. Instead events of intolerance flourish in which one group insists that they are the ones representing sanity and justice and as such representing us - believers and atheists alike. For sure, the term mercy has been replaced with words like tolerance or charity, but that's not the mercy shown by Jesus. In the bible, mercy and forgiveness are closely intertwined. Whoever shows mercy, is always forgiving the limitations of others and their surroundings without excluding religious and/or cultural beliefs. In the bible we find there are plenty of other examples of Jesus' mercy towards those who had been marginalised or despised by society. Jesus' merciful heart was never judgemental – His heart was always open to humanity showing love for everyone in need. His actions towards them were not stained with intolerance, misunderstanding and prejudice. Jesus loved them for the human beings that they were as much as He loves us for the human beings we are.
