My dear Friends:

Today is the feast of the Good Shepherd. This beautiful gospel unfolds the loving, nurturing, and protective relationship between Christ and his disciples right up to the present day. In various parts of the world in which I have worked and lived, towards dusk, the shepherd would create a circular corral of thorn bushes or stones. The entrance to this corral did not have the usual wooden gate.

The shepherd, himself, was the gate. He would sleep across the entrance to corral. Any predator attempting to attack the sheep would have to go through him first! The shepherd-sheep relationship was so intimate that the sheep would only respond to *his* voice, and *his* voice alone!

This is a very beautiful, deeply meaningful, pastoral image. However, in today's world, I think this 'image' or 'analogy' has deepened and evolved. I have often spoken about our Divine Romance with God. This Divine Romance is essentially what our individual, and collective, spiritual journeys with the Jesus, Good Shepherd is all about!

In last Sunday's gospel, when Jesus joined some of his followers on their journey to Emmaus, they reflected, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and

opened the Scriptures to us?' I really believe that as we fall deeper in love with God; as his love permeates every fibre of our being; as we are filled with his quest for justice, his strength, his courage, his boundless compassion, healing and forgiveness...he transforms the 'heart' of the sheep into the **heart of a lion**!

When I look around me at our Faith Communities, I see so much self-sacrifice, human dignity, compassion, tolerance, strength, courage, determination, and pastoral vision. I witness daily, the followers of Jesus, celebrating their baptismal priesthood. Now, and in our histories, they are the lion-hearted sheep who have become Reformers, Healers, Educators, and Prophets. They are the people who are striving to become the embodiment of Christ's Love, Healing, Compassion and Justice. They are sheep with the hearts of lions!

I believe that any 'shepherd' has to be, not just a spiritual guide and leader, but also, the pastoral 'midwife' of the giftedness, greatness and glory of God which dwell within each person. By allowing himself to become a channel of *The* Good Shepherd's passionate love for us, God can transform the sheep-hearted to the lion-hearted: *like the bamboo flute, we are raised and kissed by the lips of God*. It is God's breath passing through us which makes the music of our lives.

In the words of the great Eastern mystic, it is then that we can:

See through the eyes of compassion Listen with ears of tolerance Speak with the language of love

Remember me as loving you,

Fr. Antony

In order that it may be realized, it is always necessary to enter into deep friendship with the Lord in order to live from Him and for Him.

Let us pray that also, in these times, many young people may hear the voice of the Lord, which is always in danger of being suffocated by the clamour of other voices. Let us pray for young people: perhaps there is someone here in the Square who hears the voice of the Lord calling him to the priesthood; let us pray for him, if he is here, and for all young people who are being called. I asked four of them from the Diocese of Rome to come forward and join me in giving the blessing. May Our Lady offer her help in support of those who are called by Him, that they may be ready and generous in following his voice."

SAINT OF THE WEEK: Continuing the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales: St John Houghton (feast day 4th May)

St John Houghton was prior of the Carthusian Charterhouse at Smithfield in London. In 1534, he refused to take the Oath of Succession and was imprisoned in the Tower of London. Later, he agreed to take the oath conditionally, that is insofar as it was lawful. With the passage of the Act of Supremacy and the Act of Treason it became clear that the oath was insufficient and the Charterhouse prepared for the worst by three days of prayer, culminating in all the monks going to confession and celebrating a votive mass of the Holy Spirit. Appearing before Cromwell, the lay Ecclesiastical Vicar General, three Carthusian priors including John had their oath, 'as far as the law of God allows', refused and were imprisoned in the Tower. At their trial the jury was reluctant to declare such holy men guilty until their own lives were threatened by Cromwell. On 4 May 1535 the monks were dragged on hurdles through the streets to Tyburn to be hanged, drawn and quartered. In a final speech, John said, 'I declare that I have refused to comply with the will of His Majesty the King, not from obstinacy, malice or a rebellious spirit, but solely for fear of offending the supreme Majesty of God.' St John, pray for us.

A sudden shock can often cure your rather sad complaint."


